

Botulinum Toxin Type A advanced course

Aim:

To provide an overview on the use of Botulinum Toxin Type A for cosmetic uses.

Objectives:

Name the principal muscles involved in the treatment of the advanced areas of the face and neck using Botulinum Toxin Type A.

Define the mode of action of Botulinum Toxin Type A, explaining their therapeutic effects including limitations of use and any concerns with toxicology.

Select patients suitable for Botulinum Toxin Type A, identifying contra-indications and cautions, side effects and possible adverse reactions.

State any pre-treatment care and recognise the need for consent.

Demonstrate the safe use of Botulinum Toxin Type A in the brow lift, lower eye lid, nose (bunny lines), cheeks, gummy smiles, lower/upper lip wrinkling, chin, neck, and under arm sweating and palm hyperhidrosis, including the correct equipment, dose and injection techniques.

Summarise with appropriate written and verbal aftercare advice to patients who have received Botulinum Toxin Type A.

Demonstrate the appropriate use of clinical record taking and recall good practice in relation to handling complaints.

Describe safe storage and disposal methods for products and equipment used.

Explain the insurance requirements to practice these treatments.
